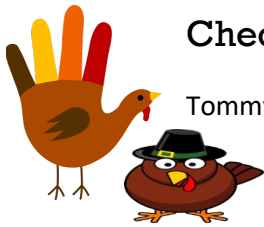




RESURRECTION PARISH      2022 AUTUMN LETTER      FROM FR. BARRY

Resurrection Masses--Tues. Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> 9 am AND at 730 pm Riderwood All Saints, 4pm

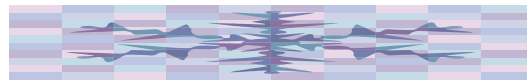
Resurrection Masses---Tues. Nov. 2 (All Souls) 9 am AND at 7:30 pm

We are handing out the All Souls envelopes at Masses, and they are also available at the parish and Riderwood office—or on tables in the church commons, as announced.

Write the intended names of your loved ones onto the **All Soul's envelope** and you also may enclose more names on a sheet that you add into the envelope. Return the envelopes (or self-made ones) ASAP in the mail, or to any collection, or to an office staff person or clergy. Cash preferred. With these intentions –we place them on the Resurrection church altar and Hall altar and Riderwood altar and Parish Rectory altar (copies) so that all the names are prayed for in a daily November Mass by a priest here.

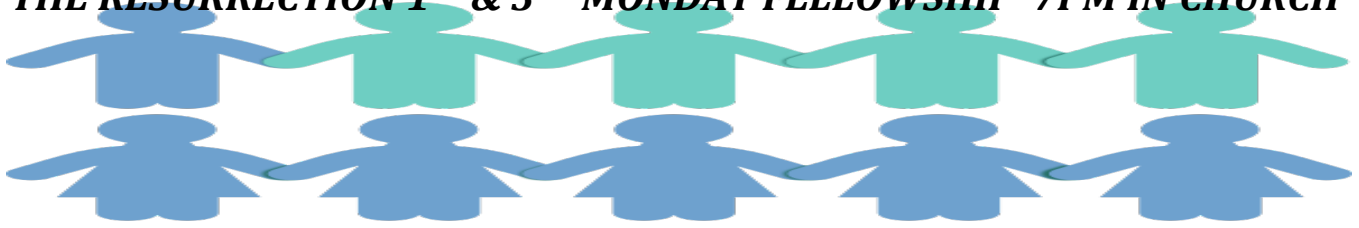

You can go to either one, held 2x a month, for a renewal in your Catholic faith

It's a gathering with Praise/Worship Songs & Catholic prayers, and a Testimonial, then A Bible Reading and A Teaching (by clergy), some Quiet Reflection, then small group sharing, and then benediction. It should be a nice parish-building time to pair up with our Sunday Eucharist in Christ.

Description: Contemporary Catholic/Christian Praise and Worship songs start the Fellowship meeting. Next, prayers and a short testimony of faith may be given by a member. We then do a Bible study together, clergy taught. Next—we take a pause to take in God's message. Then—people get into small groups (2 or 3 or 4 in each) and share, with short comments by members about those Bible teaching OR to share from four categories: 1/A recent moment close to Christ 2/A lesson received in the Faith 3/A recent action or service to God's Glory or 4/A praise to God Fellowship Convener is Fr. Barry.
